

Helping seniors stay in their homes longer.



Supporting seniors living at home and staying in their community.

Changing a lightbulb is a simple task for most people. However for some seniors changing lightbulbs and other common household chores are more than they can physically handle and can pose safety risks. The ability to keep up with household chores and home maintenance can be the difference between being able to continue living in their current home or having to move out of the community. Age Friendly funding and committee work paved the way for a citywide home supports program to help seniors to get assistance with household tasks they can no longer do for themselves. The goal is to enable seniors to live in their homes for longer.

The Seniors Home Supports Program provides Edmonton seniors with referrals to businesses,

Crestwood ^{snow}Angels

For seniors who treasure their home, every cleared sidewalk is an act of grace. Students at Crestwood School shovel snow for seniors as part of a volunteer program, earning them the title of 'Crestwood Snow Angels.' It's the way one community has connected youth in support of seniors who require a 'little help.' community groups and individuals which offer snow removal, yard help, housekeeping or minor home repair services. Six seniors organizations across Edmonton participate in the Seniors Home Supports Program to recruit and screen service providers that are reliable and economical. These district agencies help seniors living in the area by providing them with the names and contact information for providers that meet their needs.

Having access to home supports services improves safety and puts seniors at ease. "I had stopped going into my basement because I was unable to change my lightbulbs and I could not see down there," says Dawning Boston.

"The handyman is a dear. Not only did he change my lightbulbs, but he nailed down the curling rugs on the basement floor so that I wouldn't trip," she adds.

Districts do not charge seniors for giving them referrals, nor do they receive any commission or dues from the service provider.

AFE Transportation Information Hubs
