February's Lunch 'n' Learn was a Storytelling Workshop






The art of storytelling was alive and well at our most recent Lunch n' Learn hosted by ESCC. Thank you to **Adele Fontaine** author and teacher who led this session and provided encouragement and useful tips on storytelling.

Participants shared heartfelt stories of personal experiences. Their stories came alive through voice and facial expressions. "Participants sharing life stories gave us many moments of joy", said Adele.

Participants were impressed with how animated everyone was when they told their story. One participant commented, "I much prefer this kind of gathering than having to hear about seniors health issues!"

Adele provided the following storytelling tips:

- Make sure you tell a story you know really well- one that has happened in your family for example.
- Make some simple notes about the 5 W's: what, where, who, when, why.
- Set the stage for the listener by providing a beginning, middle and end to your story.
- Keep your vocabulary simple and remember that we tell stories to live and connect with others.
