## Government of Alberta

Effective April 1, 2024, Alberta seniors aged 65 and older will be eligible to receive a 25% discount on personal registry services. Services eligible for the seniors' discount include driver's licence renewals, passenger vehicle registrations, driver's abstracts, marriage licences and birth certificates.

### **Research of Interest: Loneliness and ER Visits**

Dr. Stephanie Chamberlain researches loneliness and social isolation of older adults and the related impacts on our health system. She is an Assistant Professor in the Faculty of Nursing at the University of Alberta. In January 2023, she joined the Stewardship Group for the Network (now called Edmonton Age Friendly Alliance).

A recent study looked into loneliness associated with emergency department (ED) visits. Findings showed that women are more likely than men to visit the ED. Also noted was 'the general importance of identifying loneliness in both primary care and hospital' and the need for ED staff to have 'resources to refer patients who present in this setting with health issues complicated by social conditions such as loneliness'.
