Recap: ESCC Presents at National Conference



2024 Community-Based Seniors Services Sector Summit: Claiming our Space, Naming our Future | June 2 - 4, 2024

ESCC's Program Manager of Seniors Coordinated Outreach, Asheika Sood, and our Executive Director, Sheila Hallett, had the pleasure of presenting a workshop about sector collaborations at the first national conference for Community-Based Seniors Serving organizations in Ottawa at the beginning of June.

We focused our presentation on our work as an organizing body to support collective impact projects so local senior serving agencies can focus on service delivery and meeting older adults' immediate needs. Using our longtime experience in growing such partnerships, we discussed collective action, its impact and how we can use it as a tool for ensuring stronger programming for seniors and better advocacy in our communities.

We shared some of the lessons learned and the tools we have developed to understand how to do this work, and provide the opportunity for communities to imagine new partnerships and develop stronger ways of working together. We shared examples of the Seniors Home Supports Program and Seniors Coordinated Outreach to show evolution of collaboration and its impacts.

ESCC Updates

Progress Update on ESCC Roadmap



Over three years ago Edmonton's community-based seniors serving organizations were engaged in discussions around developing a framework to support the coordination of services for Edmonton's older adults.

The purpose was to create collective agenda, a common frame of action and work to address common goals. A draft Roadmap put forward a plan for action plan "[Framework to Support Coordination of Services for Edmonton's Older Adults](#)". Since the release of the draft Roadmap in early 2021, many of the benchmarks and milestones have been addressed.

Thinking of Jasper



The staff at ESCC wish to express our profound sadness at the devastating losses due to wildfire in Jasper National Park. Our thoughts are with those who have been personally affected by the Jasper wildfires and the other fires burning in Alberta and BC. We pass along our best wishes to those fighting the fires and protecting the communities to the best of their abilities.

With the recent evacuation of Jasper and continuing wildfire season, The City of Edmonton is operating a (24 hour) Rapid Emergency Support Terminal (REST) for evacuees from Jasper and Jasper National Park at the Kennedale Site Building #2, 12814-58 Street. Evacuees are encouraged to go directly to the Kennedale site upon arrival in Edmonton if they are in need of assistance.

It has likely been on everyone minds how Community-based Seniors Serving (CBSS) Organizations can support older adults impacted by the fire evacuations. As a result of recent conversations ESCC and CBSS organizations will be creating a central SharePoint site to share and collect information related to a coordinated response so agency representatives will have access to important information such as:

- Links to City's Rapid Emergency Support Terminal
- Link to provincial page for evacuation services
- Link to 211
- Resource Supports List specific to seniors and it will include contact info for the main municipal and provincial supports for evacuees.
- A form that individual organizations can submit to share incoming calls, trends, and requests for supports to help us better understand evacuee needs.
