Men's Sheds Edmonton is a non-profit organization grounded in the spirit of camaraderie and the power of connection. From coffee meetings to full-blown workshops, these safe spaces ensure that men have opportunities to make new friends, learn new skills, and to give back to the communities in which they live.

The Men's Sheds movement understands the importance of social connection for your overall well-being. In fact, it is just as important as nutrition and exercise. To avoid the risk of isolation for older men, Men's Sheds Edmonton has partnered with link workers in the Social Prescribing program to allow for medical professionals to make referrals to Men's Sheds.

There are several active sheds within the Edmonton area, making it easy for men to find one that's right for them. With the help of its members and volunteers, Men's Sheds can combat loneliness and depression among men in the Greater Edmonton

area.

On November 1, 2024, the Edmonton Age Friendly Alliance (EAFA) is a Presenting Partner at the Caregivers Together conference. “This is a great pairing”, says EAFA Steward Dr. Karen Chan who is also an Assistant Professor at the University of Alberta and a Care of the Elderly Physician. “Caregivers play a vital role in helping seniors age in the right place, and many caregivers themselves are older adults.” Sheena Jaffer, a Certified Aging Services Professional and a Certified Aging in Place Specialist, adds, “And, we have secured excellent presenters who will be sharing information on critical areas to aging in the right place, including technology for older

adults - an area I am passionate about". Dr. Chan and Ms. Jaffer are working with other EAFA Stewards, including, Dorothy Lowrie and Naomi Fowler, as well as Edmonton Seniors Coordinating Council staff, to help raise awareness of issues impacting the well-being of older adults.

This conference is for everyone: members of the community based seniors serving sector, health and social services professionals, older adults, and, of course, caregivers. Registration for the two-day conference is only \$150 for professionals, and \$50 for caregivers.

Social Prescribing

The Edmonton Seniors 55+ Social Prescribing Project is a collaborative project funded by the Government of Alberta and Healthy Aging Alberta.

The project purposefully links the healthcare system with community-based senior serving organizations through an established referral pathway.

Since it began in mid-February 2023 and by August 31, 2024, the project has received a total of 1,236 referrals.

ESCC Updates

Welcome Muna!



Muna Jimale has recently joined ESCC as the new Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) Engagement and Research Coordinator for **the Senior Sector Inclusion Project**. Previously, she served as Manager of Policy and Advocacy at World Education Services, where she worked extensively with diverse populations, particularly immigrants and refugees, and has a history of working towards improving outcomes for marginalized communities.

The Senior Sector Inclusion Project will engage community-based seniors serving organizations and older adults, to help inform, co-develop and co-implement equitable policies, procedures, standards and/or guidelines to better support seniors from diverse lived experiences in our community. These policies will be piloted in two ESCC-coordinated programs: Seniors Coordinated Outreach and Social Prescribing. Both initiatives offer critical support to seniors, especially those from Indigenous, Black, people of colour, newcomers, 2SLGBTQ+, and low-income communities, by addressing their social, financial, and support needs and challenges.

Insights from this project will inform broader ESCC-led initiatives to create collaborative spaces for on-going constructive conversations. Some specialized tools and coaching supports will assist organizations to add and/or improve services that demonstrate EDI. Shared broadly, these initiatives can help to create a more inclusive and supportive environment for all seniors in Edmonton.





October 14, 2024


Thanksgiving Day in Canada is linked to the European tradition of harvest festivals.
