#### "Empowering Aging in Community" Recap



Edmonton Age Friendly Alliance (EAFA) hosted their "Empowering Aging in Community" speaker series on November 1, during the Caregivers Together conference in Edmonton. Around 80 people heard from guest speakers on some of EAFA's top focus areas. Dr. Rose Joudi (Ph.D. Psych), Research Lead at Carya, offered practical strategies to enhance well-being and promote social inclusion for ethnically diverse older adults in her talk on Diversity and Aging. Tessa Hubbell, Population and Public Health Dietitian at Alberta Health Services, and Sonja Zacharko, Executive Director at Edmonton Meals on Wheels, discussed social factors influencing nutrition for older adults and the role meal services can play in supporting healthy aging in the community during their talks on Food Insecurity, Nutrition and Aging. The third speaker, Dr. Eleni Stroulia, Professor in Computing Science and Vice-Dean of Science at the University of

Alberta, shared how high-tech games can support fun and well-being for older adults, during her session on GeronTechnology.

# Changes to Using Edmonton Transit Sales of Paper Tickets and Passes Ended Nov 9.

Arc, the regional electronic fare payment system, is now available to all ETS riders.

As of November 9, the following fare products are **no longer available** for purchase through the Edmonton Service Centre, the ETS online fare store, phone sales or retail outlets: 10 ticket packs; Family/Day passes; monthly paper transit passes (Adult, Youth, Senior, Ride Transit and Edmonton International Airport)

ETS will continue to accept adult, youth and senior paper tickets with an **expiry date of December 31**, **2023**, as valid fare **until December 31**, **2025**. Family/Day passes with an expiry date of 2024 will also be accepted as valid fare until the end of 2025. Cash fares and paper transfers will continue to be a valid form of payment on ETS.
